Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This year our town is celebrating its tricentennial. Our own Slovak Zion Synod is celebrating 100 years of mission and ministry. In both of these, our congregation has been part of the story and has helped to shape the lives and stories of many people.

Part of being a Christian is recognizing that we are in a story that is bigger than ourselves. We are part of God's story, played out in history as we receive blessings and share a love that is bigger than anything we could shape ourselves. We are part of Jesus' story, sisters and brothers of the one who gave everything to make us a family and to give us an abundant and new life.

So much of our anxiety as human beings arises from wondering what people think of us, or what our legacy will be. As Christians we know that our worth is not determined by our education, or our salaries, or our popularity. Our worth is measured by Christ's love for us. Luther says that Jesus has "purchased and won me, not with gold or silver, but with his own precious blood... so that I may belong to him, live under him in his kingdom, and serve him in eternal righteousness, innocence and blessedness." Jesus brings each of us into a new life where we are free from our very human desires to try and cheat death, or keep up with the Joneses, or make a name for ourselves.

Everything we do, we are part of a bigger story. And so our successes are Christ's. We no longer serve ourselves and our own interests, but we serve Christ and those whom he loves. Likewise, and more importantly, Jesus' success is our own. His life is our own, his victory is our own. And so we are freed to let his love be our own, his charity our own.

As we celebrate the milestones of our communities, we give thanks for what we are blessed to be a part of. Let us strive to see ourselves and each other as in it all together, part of God's story, blessed with gifts we could never get by going-it alone, and happy to share a life of loving others as we have been loved.

One of the most beloved of our offertory hymns says:

''Let the vineyards be fruitful Lord,
And fill to the brim our cup of blessing.
Gather a harvest from the seeds that were sown.
That we may be fed with the Bread of Life.
Gather the hopes and dreams of all,
Unite them with the prayers we offer.
Grace our table with your presence,
And give us a foretaste of the feast to come."

These words draw our attention to what happens when we gather to be nourished by God's word and the sacrament of Holy Communion. God has been hard at work, sowing seeds, giving growth, and making of us a pleasing offering. When we come to worship we are bringing all that we have: not simply our gifts and treasures, but also the greatest offering we can present, ourselves. Our hopes and dreams, our wants and our needs come to God in who we are and become an offering when we open our hearts and our wills to be transformed by meeting God in worship.

However, in our offering, in our giving of ourselves, we discover what is truly great and marvelous. When we are willing to offer all that we are to God, we find that God is in fact offering himself for us. When we open our lives to his, we find a God who does not take simply take our offering, but who adds to it. To our treasure God adds abundance, to our love God adds excellence, to our good works God adds perfection, and to our selves, God gives himself.

This is because we have a God who has shown us the measure of his love. In Jesus we see God who graces us with his presence. Who gives us a foretaste of the feast to come. Just as by Jesus' precious death upon the cross we are saved, by his resurrection we are justified, Paul says, and this same Jesus gives himself to us to be our food and our nourishment, to be our health and our salvation. God who was made known among us as Emmanuel, is God-with-us whenever we gather in faith where he has promised to be.

Let us joyfully offer our lives to God, so that we may receive always the abundance of Jesus' own life which was first offered for us.

The Slovak Zion symbol is inside the 00 of 100. Available in adult sizes S – 3XL and children's sizes YS (8); YM (10) and YL (12).

Theme Shirt

The navy blue crew neck shirt shows off the theme of the synod's theme of the 2019 Assembly with the words "A Century RESILIENCE and God's Blessings" on the front with the words "Celebrating 100 Years"

on the back of the shirt. The Slovak Zion symbol is inside the 00 of 100. Available in adult sizes S-3XL and children's sizes YS (8); YM (10) and YL (12).
