#### **Dear Sisters and Brothers**

The season of Advent is a season of preparation. Like Lent, it originally was a time of fasting, study, and preparation to joyfully celebrate and fully appreciate the feast that it leads up to. Preparing to celebrate the birth of our Savior is for Christians more than just cleaning and buying and planning.

We prepare to receive our Lord anew, and reflect on how as he did once in Bethlehem, God comes to us at unexpected times and in unexpected places. While the prophets foretold that Jesus would be born in Bethlehem, among the cattle and the donkeys, it was nevertheless a surprise to many that a king would be born in such a humble place. Indeed, even the Three Wise Men, who travelled to worship the newborn King, stopped first in Jerusalem, perhaps naturally assuming that the newborn King of the Jews would be born in a palace in the capital of Judea.

But it is not only this first-coming that was unexpected. During this time we think about the other unexpected places God comes to us again to still be Emmanuel, "God who is with us." We reflect on Jesus coming to us and nourishing us in the humble meal of bread and wine that we share together. We reflect on Jesus coming to us in "the least of these, his brothers and sisters," telling us that whatever we do (or do not do) for our neighbor in need, we do to him. And lastly we reflect on Jesus coming to us at the end of time, "unexpectedly... like a thief in the night." Whether we see our Lord's second-coming on the last day and the end of history when he will come in glory on the clouds, or whether we see our Lord's second coming when he comes for us individually at the end of our life to take us home, we do not want to be unprepared. For this reason Saint Ireneus (a student of Saint Polycarp, who himself was a student of Saint John, the Evangelist) said, "The business of a Christian is nothing else but preparing for death." This sounds harsh to our modern ears but the saint is of course right. We prepare to die to self and our egos so that we can live for others, until we die to our bodies so that we can live with Christ forever.

The year that has drawn to a close has been a challenge. We have been given ample opportunity to love and serve our neighbors. We have been reminded of death and the uncertainty of our own futures. And so perhaps more than ever in our lifetimes, we are called to be prepared. Prepared to love others and prepared and to meet Jesus whether he comes to us in the form of one in need or at the last day – or our last day – on the clouds of heaven.

Phillip Nicolai, a Lutheran pastor born in 1556 in Germany, penned a beautiful Advent hymn that embraces this mystery and calls Christians to "wake up" and prepare. When the plague hit his town of Unna, Nicolai lost two sisters and 1,300 parishioners in the course of a year. One day, he records, they dug 30 graves. Overwhelmed, he took solace in Christ's promises and wrote these words, recalling the parable of the wise and foolish virgins we read only a few weeks ago (Matthew 25:1-13):

Wake, awake, for night is flying; the watchmen on the heights are crying: Awake, Jerusalem, at last!
Midnight hears the welcome voices and at the thrilling cry rejoices; come forth, ye virgins, night is past; the Bridegroom comes, awake; your lamps with gladness take:
Alleluia!



#### And for his marriage feast prepare,

A Journey to Bethlehem Follow in Mary's Foot Steps

for ye must go and meet him there.

Zion hears the watchmen singing, and all her heart with joy is springing; she wakes, she rises from her gloom; for her Lord comes down all-glorious, the strong in grace, in truth victorious. Her Star is risen; her Light is come. Ah come, thou blessed One, God's own beloved Son: Alleluia!

We follow till the halls we see where thou hast bid us sup with thee.

Now let all the heavens adore thee, and saints and angels sing before thee, with harp and cymbal's clearest tone; of one pearl each shining portal, where we are with the choir immortal of angels round thy dazzling throne; nor eye hath seen, nor ear hath yet attained to hear what there is ours; but we rejoice and sing to thee our hymn of joy eternally.



Let us also take such comfort from our Lord's promise to be with us until that day he comes to take us home that we might also always rejoice to greet him when he comes to us, recognize him in the humble bread and wine and friend and stranger, and serve him, knowing that in such love we get a glimpse of eternity.
