"...Neither count I my life dear unto myself..." --Acts 20:24thers

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In the days of the early church, Christians had to make a living even as you and I --some of them carved and gilded images for the pagans. They did not worship these images, of course, nor did they bow in their shrines, but they saw no harm in making and polishing images for sale. Their argument sounds familiar today: "After all, somebody will do it, anyway --and I

have to live." Tertullian, one of the great theologians of that day, answered such an argument with one question: *"Must you live?"*

A shocking question, isn't it? But Tertullian wants you, and me, dear Christian, to think seriously... what kind of a life is life without Christ? What kind of a life is a life without faith?

Every life has value. But for the

Christian, Jesus is what gives our life the greatest meaning. He is the measure of our joy, of our love, and of our hope. '*Must you live*?' Tertullian held that a Christian has only one "must" --she must be faithful to Jesus Christ, come what may, live or die. There were no ifs and reservations and alibis. One did not have to live; he had only to be true to the Master. "We ought to obey God rather than men." -- Acts 5:29

A lot of water has run under the bridge since Tertullian. On Sunday morning multitudes of Church members sing: "Faith of our fathers, holy faith, We will be true to thee till death." October ends and November begins with the remembrances of the faithful departed: All Saints and All Souls. We give thanks for their lives, for the faith they shared with us, and we pray that their memory might be a witness to us that Christ is our Lord and our all, in life, in death, and in the life of the world to come.



Below is a copy from a page of William Bradfords explanation of the First Thanksgiving. It is in the vernacular of the time. for example "ye" means "the". If you close your eye and

imagine what a pilgrim looks like. You may have imagined someone wearing black and white, with a funny hat, if you did, you would be incorrect, that in fact is a Puritan. The (ye) Pilgrims were more akin to modern day Pentecostals who wore bright colors and cloaks with purple linings.

The year before they almost starved to death because their charter stated that everyone was to be given a n equal share regardless as to how much labor they contributed. They then went against their financiers and assigned each family group a parcel of land, and basically said that what ever you raise you could keep. Thus socialism was ended in the colony, even at risk of their financing. He also

"*I may not here omite how, notwithstand all their great paines & industrie, and ye great hops of a large cropp, the Lord seemed to blast, & take away the same, and to threaten further & more sore famine unto them, by a great drought which continued from ye 3. weeke in May, till about ye midle of July, without any raine, and with great heat (for ye most parte), insomuch as ye corne begane to wither away, though it was set with fishe, the moysture wherof helped it much. Yet at length it begane to languish sore, and some of ye drier grounds were partched like withered hay, part wherof was never recovered. Upon which they sett a parte a solemne day of humilliation, to seek ye Lord by humble & fervente prayer, in this great distrese. And he was pleased to give them a gracious & speedy answer, both to their owne, & the Indeans admiration, that lived amongest them. For all ye morning, and greatest part of the day, it was clear weather & very hotte, and not a cloud or any signe of raine to be seen, yet toward evening it begane to overcast, and shortly after to raine, with shuch sweete and gentle showers, as gave them cause of rejoyceing, & blesing God. It came, without either wind, or thunder, or any violence, and by degreese in yt abundance, as that ye earth was thorowly wete and soked therwith. Which did so apparently revive & guicken ye decayed corne & other fruits, as was wonderfull to see, and made ye Indeans astonished to behold; and afterwards the Lord sent them shuch seasonable showers, with enterchange of faire warme weather, as, through his blessing, caused a fruitfull & liberall harvest, to their no small comforte and rejoycing. For which mercie (in time conveniente) they also sett aparte a day of thanksgiveing. This being overslipt in its place, I thought meet here to inserte ye same....

makes note that there were Indians (Native Americans) living amongst them Please take the time to reflect on it this Thanksgiving
